Putting the Challenge in Perspective – Over the course of a lifetime, a high school dropout earns, on average, about \$260,000 less than a high school graduate...If the country's dropouts from the class of 2006 had graduated, the nation could have saved more than \$17 billion in Medicaid and expenditures for uninsured health care over the course of those young people's lifetimes...Increasing the graduation rate and college matriculation of male students in the United States by just 5 percent could lead to combined savings and revenue of almost \$8 billion each year by reducing crime-related costs.

Communities In Schools of Baytown, Inc. (CISB) – was founded in 1993 and is affiliated with the nation's largest and most effective nonprofit organization devoted to dropout prevention. Our mission is to *surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life*. CISB currently serves over 1500 students each year within the Goose Creek Consolidated Independent School District (GCCISD), throughout the District's eleven secondary schools (6th – 12th grades). Case Managers are assigned to work full-time on each campus to assess students' needs. Our partnerships are essential! We partner with school staff (principals, counselors, social workers, teachers, etc.) local social service agencies, health care providers, businesses, individual volunteers, and others in the community. This is to insure a comprehensive case-management approach to meet identified needs and to address underling issues that hamper student's success. Our focus remains to help students succeed in the classroom, in life and in their community!

Accomplishments: *Based on our extensive documentation, 90 – 98% of our students significantly improve in academics, attendance, and/or behavior. They stay in school. They graduate. And, they are prepared for success in post-secondary life!*

Five Core Basics – We believe there are 5 core components that every child needs and deserves:

- A one-on-one relationship with a caring adult
- A safe place to learn and grow
- A marketable skill to use upon graduation
- A chance to give back to peers and community
- A healthy start and healthy future
